Houston-based textile queen Courtney Barton opens up shop in Round Top, bringing big-city style and globally sourced goods to the tiny Texas town.

Didn't make it to Round Top's Fall Antiques Fair last month? No need to pout-there's a new reason to head to this teeny hamlet, and it's open year-round. Famous for her East-meets-West aesthetic, Courtney Barton delivers a curated crop of patterned textiles, home accents, vintage furnishings and apothecary products to her recently opened boutique. The designer's eponymous concept is nestled in Round Top Village, the town's new cluster of specialty shops. The storefront's casita-style design lends itself to the shop's charming interiors, which Barton customized from start to finish. The store's century-old wooden counter from India is indicative of Barton's love of the Far East—as are the floor-to-ceiling shelves stacked with block-print pillows and *dohar* blankets. While much of the inventory will look familiar to fans of Barton's Houston emporium, there are a few items said to be specific to the Round Top edition, such as colorful bandanas, bespoke stationery, bold umbrellas and an assortment of affordably priced gifts. 603 N.
